If you haven't achieved a Grade 4 or above at GCSE you will continue to work towards it with our dedicated Maths and English tutors. If you already have Grade 4 or above, we will work with you to further strengthen and develop these valued skills.

English & Maths

Why do you need skills in English and maths?

English and maths are important. A lack of English or maths qualifications can have a big impact on your future education and career path, so it's hugely important to ensure you leave education with the basics.

Even if English is your second language it is important to show you can communicate confidently when speaking and writing. Without a qualification in either of the core subjects, your future could be affected – and not in a good way.

There are many benefits associated with working on and developing your skills in English and maths:

- A rise in earning potential you are more likely to make more money if you have these qualifications
- More career opportunities you are more likely to have a wider and more varied choice of job or career if you have these qualifications
- Better educational possibilities you are more likely to gain places on higher level educational courses if you have these qualifications
- ♣ Increased life satisfaction you are more likely to feel happier about life in general as you will understand more!

For those who don't believe that basic English and maths skills have a big role to play in life, have a look at the following points:

+ Understanding special offers in shops

Maths provides a superb life skill by allowing you to quickly and easily calculate discounts and percentages in shops, as well as the potential savings achievable with certain reductions.

♣ Working out your earnings

Your payslip can also be complicated, with deductions for this, for that and for the other. You'll want to make sure you're paying the right amount of tax and the correct earnings are coming your way – which is where maths comes in.

Reading and understanding timetables

According to recent statistics, up to 65% of adults can't read a bus timetable and accurately plan their journey. This is frightening and one of the analytical skills Maths teaches you.

Sending emails and communicating with others in the workplace

Whenever emailing from your work address you'll be the voice of where you work. Therefore, you will need to demonstrate a good level of spelling and grammar – two core skills English will provide.

+ Help others with English and maths

Many children come home from school seeking the help of their parents, brothers and sisters for homework they don't understand. If you have the knowledge of basic English and maths skills, you will be able to provide them with the help they need – and acquire superhero status overnight!



IGCSE English as a Second Language

For those students who use another language in their day-to-day lives, whether it be Portuguese, Polish, Thai, Romanian, Hungarian or any other of the 7,000 languages in the modern world, we offer the Cambridge IGCSE English as a Second Language.

This qualification has exactly the same value as the IGCSE English as a First Language, it is accepted throughout the college as an entry requirement for any of our courses and it is a valid qualification for universities and other further education.

The course will help you to communicate better in a variety of writing styles, improve your vocabulary and range of expression in your spoken language and give you a better understanding of how the language works.

Alternatively, if you are not quite ready for the IGCSE, we do offer other Cambridge qualifications such as KET and PET.

Qualifications at Highlands 6th

The Jersey Progression Qualification

This Diploma is broadly equivalent to 4 GCSEs at grades A* to C and the Certificate is equivalent to 2 GCSEs at Grades A* to C. It is designed for school leavers to improve their level of general education by studying a work-related subject to a level that will enable them to progress to advanced level in the same or a related subject. The qualification is awarded by NCFE (see: http://www.ncfe.org.uk/about-ncfe) and endorsed by the States of Jersey.

Technical Certificates and Diplomas

These are qualifications accredited by English Awarding Bodies such as ABC, City and Guilds and IMIAL in England and regulated by Ofqual. They are awarded at Level 2 Certificate and Level 3 Diploma and are recognised by employers as entry qualifications into the related industries.

General Diplomas

These are qualifications at Level 3 that are equivalent to 2 or 3 A-levels and are recognised as entry qualifications to university or direct access to employment at technician or junior level jobs. They are awarded and accredited by BTEC [Pearsons], CACHE [Council for Awards in Care, Health and Education], OCR [Oxford, Cambridge and RSA] and UAL [University of the Arts London], which are English awarding bodies regulated by Ofqual.



Course Costs

There are costs associated with each course that you will need to pay before you start at Highlands. The College has a hardship fund for those students who would find it difficult or impossible to study because of their financial circumstances. Cost need not be a barrier to study, but you must contact Highlands Information Centre as soon as you have accepted an offer of a place to discuss financial support. The hardship fund is limited and funds are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis and are only available for low income households or individuals.

Each course has the following fee elements:

1

Tuition Fee

If you are aged 16, 17 or 18 on the 1st September 2017, there are no tuition fees to pay as these are paid by the States of Jersey.

If you are 19 or over on the 1st September 2017, the course fees will be waived if you have not previously studied and gained qualifications at levels 1 (5 or more GCSEs at grades D to G or equivalent), 2 (5 or more GCSEs at grades A* to C or equivalent) or 3 (2 or more GCE A levels at grades A* to E or equivalent).

If you are 19 or over on the 1st September 2017 and are repeating your studies at Levels 1, 2 or 3 there is a tuition fee cost.

2

Exam Fee

If you are aged 16, 17 or 18 on the 1st September 2016, there are no exam fees to pay as these are paid by the States of Jersey. However, if you fail to sit an examination, your attendance falls below 95%, you do not submit your assignments on time, or you leave the course, you are liable to pay the examination fees*. The only exceptions to this are for personal ill-health reasons or the illness or bereavement of a close family member for which documentary evidence is required.

If you are 19 or over on the 1st September 2016 and are repeating your studies at Levels 1, 2 or 3 you are required to pay the examination fee.

3

Subscription Fee

This is an annual fee that all students pay. It covers the cost of enrolment and provides you with an IT account, access to the virtual learning environment [Moodle] and membership of the College library. The subscription fee for 2017/18 is £35.

4

Materials and Equipment Fee

This varies, depending on which course you are studying. There is a basic material fee of £60 for all courses, which provides a free printing allowance and a basic set of materials for your course. There are additional fees applicable to each course. For example, a uniform or protective clothing fee of between £20 and £60 is payable for courses where this is a requirement. Some courses require you to purchase a set text book for around £30.

The material and equipment fee is payable by all students.

Special Fees

Some courses have a special fee applied to them. For example, any course where you will be working with children or vulnerable adults requires you to have a DBS check, and this costs £50.
