You will be looking through the pages that follow because:

(a) you are currently a student at one of our partner secondary schools who will be taking your GCSEs in the summer of 2018 or

(b) you are currently a student at Highlands looking for your next level of course to start in September 2018 or

(c) you are currently a sixth former at another island 6th form considering a change to a vocational or technical course or

(d) you are looking to return to study in full-time education.

Whichever of these circumstances applies to you, you will find a course at Highlands that will set you on your path to employment, to an apprenticeship or to higher learning.

Making the right course choice for you is not always easy, but there are lots of people to help you. You can talk to your Careers Teachers in school, you can meet one of our Transition Tutors or our Employability team who will guide you and Careers Jersey is there to give you independent advice and guidance.

At Highlands, you will be treated as an adult and gain an experience that prepares you for working life and a social life with responsibilities.


You may start with us on the one year Jersey Progression Qualification from a choice of thirteen different subjects. This is Jersey's own unique level 2 course which prepares you to progress onto an industry recognised or university recognised qualification. If you have high enough grades, including a grade 4 or above in English or maths, and you are familiar with the subject or have the relevant skills, then you can start straight away on a two year advanced level course.

At Highlands we offer a range of alternative qualifications to A levels that are of an equivalent standard to enable you to progress onto specialist University Degrees in subjects such as Accounting, Animal Management, Art, Built Environment, Business, Childcare, Computing, Design, Education, Financial Management, Health, Hospitality Management, Marketing, Media, Tourism, Performing Arts and Sport.

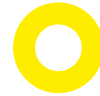

IGCSE ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

For students who use another language in their day-to-day lives, whether it be Portuguese, Polish, Thai, Romanian, Hungarian or any other of the 7,000 languages in the modern world, we offer the Cambridge iGCSE English as a Second Language qualification.

This has the same value as the iGCSE English as a First Language, is accepted throughout the college as an entry requirement for any of our courses, and is a valid qualification for universities and other further education institutions.

The course will help to improve your communication in a variety of writing styles, improve your vocabulary and range of expression in your spoken language and give you a better understanding of how the English language works.

Alternatively, if you're not quite ready for the iGCSE, we offer other Cambridge qualifications such as KET (Key English Test) and PET (Preliminary English Test).

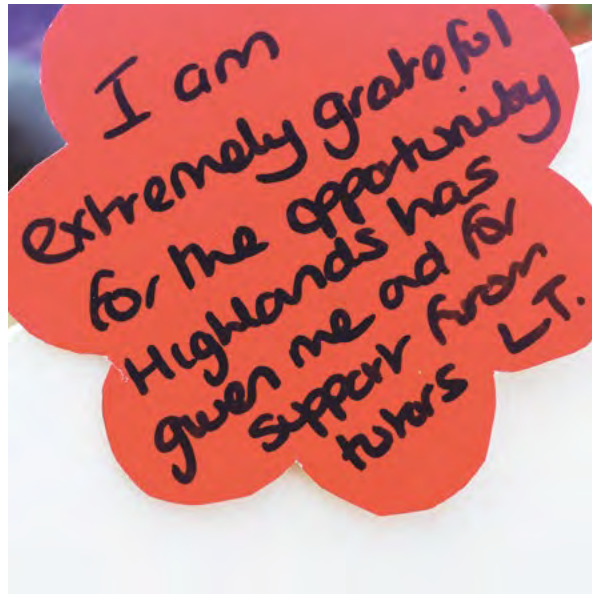

WHICH COURSE?

There are a wide range of course programmes and subjects for you to choose from. All of our courses will prepare you for employment and/or university, so it's important you pick the course that best suits your career plans.

THE JERSEY PROGRESSION QUALIFICATION

The Diploma provides the equivalent of 4 GCSEs at grades A* to C (4 to 9) and the Certificate is the equivalent of 2 GCSEs at Grades A* to C (4 to 9). It's designed for school leavers to improve your level of general education by studying a work-related subject to a level that will enable you to progress to an advanced level in the same or a related subject. The qualification is awarded by NCFE and endorsed by the States of Jersey.

TECHNICAL CERTIFICATES AND DIPLOMAS

These are qualifications accredited by English awarding bodies such as ABC, City and Guilds and IMIAL and regulated by Ofqual. They're awarded at Level 2 Certificate and Level 3 Diploma and are recognised by employers as entry qualifications into their related industries.

GENERAL DIPLOMAS

These are qualifications at Level 3 that are the equivalent of 2 or 3 A-levels and are recognised as entry qualifications to university or direct access to employment at technician or junior level jobs. They're awarded and accredited by BTEC (Pearson), CACHE (Council for Awards in Care, Health and Education), OCR (Oxford, Cambridge and RSA) and UAL (University of the Arts London), which are English awarding bodies regulated by Ofqual.

What will I learn?

What will I learn?

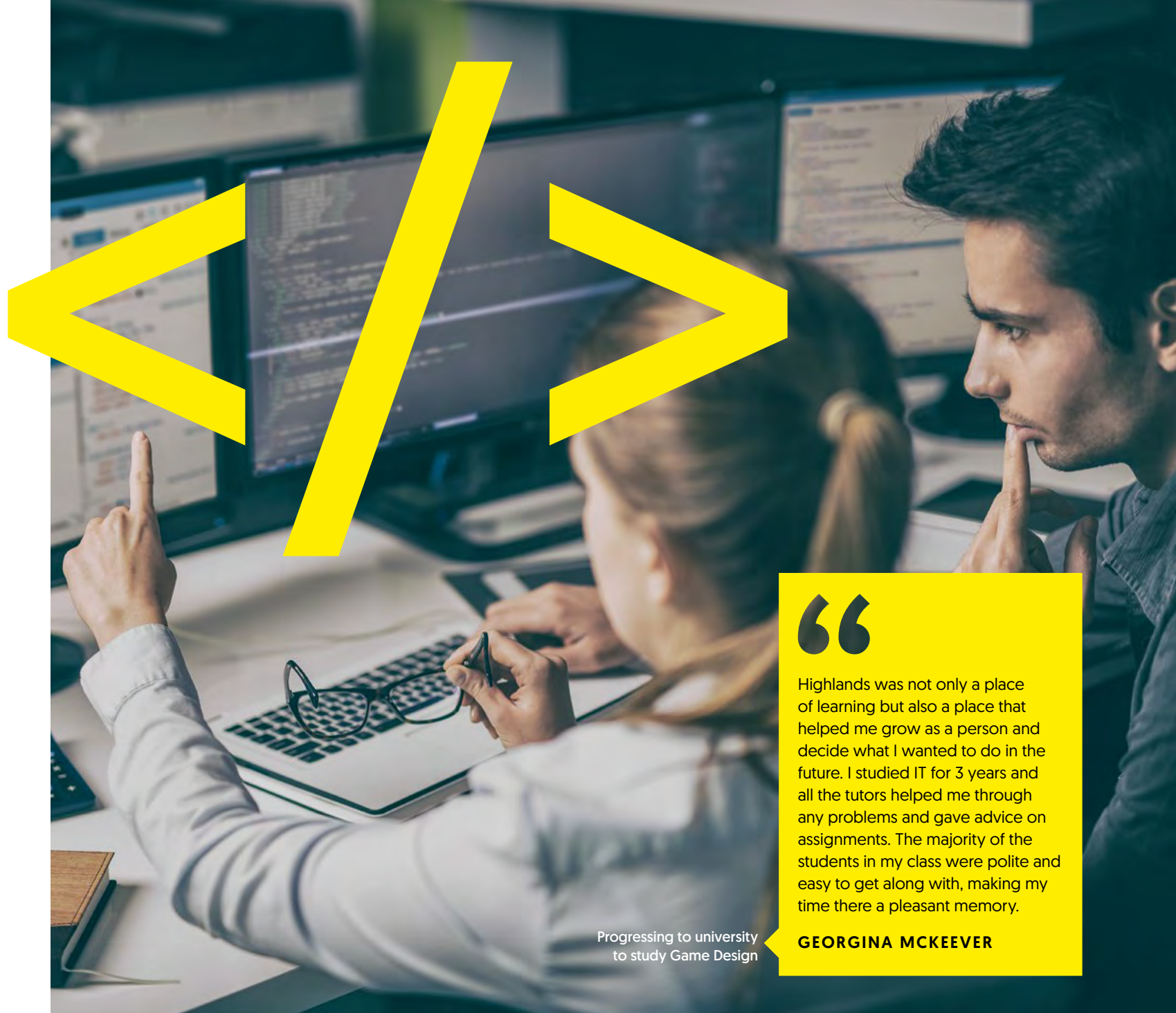

What will I learn?

In Year 1 you'll develop skills in areas such as facials, eye treatments, waxing, manicures, pedicures and make-up, as well as learning the principles of health and safety and reception duties. In Year 2 you'll cover a larger range of specialist beauty treatments such as body massage, body and facial electrical treatments, aromatherapy and Indian head massage.

You will also develop your business and sales skills by learning about the financial aspects of running a beauty business and how to go about promoting additional goods and services.*

Courses we offer and entry requirements:

Jersey Progression Qualification in Hair and Beauty

You need: Min. x5 GCSEs grade D-E (grade 2-3) or higher, including both maths and English.

Beauty Therapy Apprenticeship (Levels 2 & 3)

You need: Min. x4 GCSEs Grade D (Grade 3-4) or higher, one to be English.

Applicants must be already employed in industry. Applicants who have English as a second language, Level 1 ESOL will be required. There are no age restrictions on this course.

Please contact us if you are unsure if you meet the entry criteria.

What could I progress on to?

Once you have achieved a Level 3 qualification you can apply for any of our Foundation or Honours Degrees at University College Jersey (UCJ). Many of our students move into careers in salon and spa management, become business owners, work on cruise liners, teach and assess within Hair and Beauty, train and educate within salons, become film/TV make-up artists or beauty therapists.

What will I learn?

This general engineering course covers practical work with theory to develop the skills required to enter the Mechanical Engineering Manufacturing industry where design, manufacturing and problem solving skills are required. You'll train within fully equipped workshops and learn how to safely complete various metalwork projects and welding tasks. You'll learn how to use all the basic engineering hand tools plus fabrication machinery and welding equipment. You'll also learn how to use CAD to produce engineering drawings.

Courses we offer and entry requirements:

Jersey Progression Qualification in Mechanical Engineering and Welding Studies

You need: Min. x5 GCSEs grade D-E (grade 2-3) or higher, including both maths and English.

ABC Certificate in Welding and Fabrication Practice [Level 2]

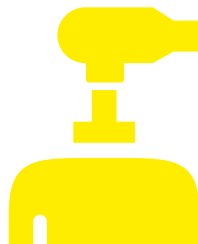
You need: Grade D in English and maths or Level 1 Functional Maths and Literacy and already be employed within the industry.

What could I progress on to?

Once you've achieved a Level 3 qualification in engineering you can progress to the new HNC Diploma in Civil Engineering, launching in September 2017 with University College Jersey (UCJ). You could also become an apprentice and gain nationally and internationally recognised qualifications from the Awarding Body Consortium (ABC) up to a Level 3 Diploma. Students go on to become civil engineers, architectural technologists, and work for gas, electricity, water and infrastructure companies, engineering companies or offshore/onshore petrochemical industries.

You need: Min. x5 GCSEs grade D-E (grade 2-3) or higher, including both maths and English.

Apprenticeship in Motor Vehicle Maintenance and Repair at Levels 2 & 3

You need: Min. x4 GCSEs Grade D including English, maths and science and be employed within the motor industry.

Please contact us if you are unsure if you meet the entry criteria.

What could I progress on to?

Once you've achieved a Level 3 qualification you can apply for any of our Foundation or Honours Degrees at University College Jersey (UCJ). Students go on to undertake mechanical apprenticeships or become spray painters, automotive technicians for light vehicle or heavy vehicle and agricultural or plant vehicles, vehicle valets, service receptionists, parts consultants or panel beaters.

What will I learn?

This full-time 3-year course is for students who require additional support with learning. Experienced support staff work alongside tutors to provide a student-focused learning experience. Students study maths, English, ICT and develop a variety of personal and social skills designed to increase independence and employability.

Courses we offer and entry requirements:

You need: No formal qualifications required. Students should be able to move safely around a busy, open site and work in small groups with their peers.

AQA Unit Awards in: Personal, social and health education, maths, English and ICT

You need: No formal qualifications required.

What could I progress on to?

Students can progress to STEPS and Jersey Employment Trust, who provide support with job seeking and improving pre-employment skills. Some students are successful in securing part-time or full-time employment as a result of work experience or training opportunities, including Beresford St. Kitchen and Waitrose. What will I learn?

This is an intensive one year course which enables learners without the necessary academic qualifications to begin a degree, to gain a Level 3 certificate with A-level equivalency, to qualify and prepare them for degree-level study. We offer this as one of two pathways: Access with Humanities or Access with Science, both designed to enable learners to progress onto a broad range of degree subjects.*

* The course is challenging and intensive, condensing the content of a traditional A-level programme into one year. Learners should be prepared to commit time and effort to their studies in order to succeed.

Courses we offer and entry requirements:

GCSE attainment at Grade C/4 or above in English Language, maths and potentially Science, depending on your chosen pathway.

You need: to be at least 18 yrs old at the start of the course. At interview you need to demonstrate that you have the potential to study at Level 3 [A-Level], as well as a desire to progress on to Higher Education.

What could I progress on to?

Successful students have progressed onto degree courses at University College Jersey and also in humanities and sciences at a number of UK universities. Students have gone on to become midwives, nurses, pharmacists, teachers, chemists, researchers and more.

FEES



There are certain costs associated with each course that you'll need to pay before you start college. There is a hardship fund available for those students who may find it difficult or impossible to study because of their financial circumstances. Cost need not be a barrier to study, but you must contact our Student Life team as soon as you have accepted an offer to discuss financial support. The hardship fund is limited and funds are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis and are only available for low income households or individuals.

Each course has the following fee elements:

TUITION FEE FOR ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION

If you're aged 18 on the 1st September 2018, there are no tuition fees to pay as these are paid by the States of Jersey.

If you're 19 or over on the 1st September 2018, the course fees will be waived if you have not previously studied and gained qualifications at Level 3 (one or more GCE A-Levels at grades A* to E or equivalent).

If you're 19 or over on the 1st September 2018 and are repeating your studies at Level 3, there is a tuition fee cost of £3,050. You can apply for a tuition fee waiver if you can demonstrate the need for the Access to HE qualification in order to progress to a science or humanities degree e.g. Nursing, Social Sciences or Psychology and Criminology.

EXAM FEE

If you're aged 16, 17 or 18 on the 1st September 2018, there are no exam fees to pay as these are paid by the States of Jersey. However, if you fail to sit an examination, your attendance falls below 95%, you do not submit your assignments on time, or you leave the course, you are

liable to pay the examination fees. The only exceptions to this are for reasons of personal ill-health or the illness or bereavement of a close family member of which documentary evidence is required.

If you're 19 or over on the 1st September 2018 and are repeating your studies at Levels 1, 2 or 3, you are required to pay the examination fee.

SUBSCRIPTION FEE

This is an annual fee that all students are required to pay. It covers the cost of enrolment and provides you with an IT account, access to the virtual learning environment (Moodle) and membership of the college library. The subscription fee for 2018/19 is £36.

MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT FEE

This varies, depending on which course you're studying. There's a basic material fee of £60 for all courses, which provides a free printing allowance and a basic set of materials for your course. There are additional fees applicable to each course. For example, a uniform or protective clothing fee between £20 - £60 is payable for courses where this is a requirement. Some courses require you to purchase a specific text book for around £30. The material and equipment fee is payable by all students.

SPECIAL FEES

Some courses have a special fee applied to them. For example, any course where you will be working with children or vulnerable adults requires you to have a DBS check, and this costs £50. Students enrolled on Health & Social Care and Childcare courses will also have to register for the DBS Update service at £13 per year.
