We have agreed to support the Government of Jersey four yearly Jersey Children and Young People's Survey. This Island wide survey is organised by Statistics Jersey and aims to survey all children in school years 4, 6, 8, 10 and 12. The results will be used by Government departments (such as the Health and Community Services and the Children, Young People, Education and Skills Department) to improve children's services in the Island, and by the schools to plan our PHSE lessons.

Information is collected via the 'SMARTSURVEY' web based application. Information is entered directly into the website, which compiles all the answers for analysis by Statistics Jersey. The surveys will be completely anonymous, once completed there is no way to link the results to individual pupils.

Statistics Jersey will be able to do detailed analysis but no answers that could be attributed to an individual will be published.

The topics that the survey covers include;

- Food and Diet
- Physical Activity
- Leisure and Money
- Smoking, drinking and illegal drugs
- Health and Safety
- Relationships and Mental Health (including sexual health and questions about child sexual exploitations for Secondary students)
