 To provide you with an education which: Offers you opportunities to achieve your potential Builds your confidence Develops skills and knowledge you will need to progress Offers you opportunities to use your imagination and work creatively Celebrates diversity in our community 	 Arrive properly equipped, follow instructions from tutors, hand in work on time and attend all examinations Behave responsibly, sensibly and maturely at all times in College and when involved in College related activities Always wear your I.D. Badge and lanyard unless there is a health and safety risk Wear any safety equipment required for your programme of studies Provide College with details of any additional needs you may have that could affect your learning
Allows you to respect others and the environment around you	The College will not tolerate any of the following behaviours or actions; bullying, violence, racism, rudeness, inappropriate or abusive language, vandalism, theft, use of alcohol or illegal drugs, or any other illegal actions on the campus. Repeated or serious misconduct may mean you are placed on authorised absence and required to remain out of College during a period of investigation, and you may be removed from your study programme.
