WHAT MAKES UP YOUR STUDY PROGRAMME?

The aim of our curriculum is to prepare students for their next steps, whether this be to university or the workplace. Whichever path you choose to follow, our curriculum will help to ensure that you develop a range of skills for the future.

All our courses are made up of the following aspects to enhance your experience, knowledge, and skills and to prepare you for success:

EMPLOYABILITY AND WORK EXPERIENCE

All courses at Highlands College incorporate the development of employability skills and are taught through tutor-led sessions and an online learning platform. You'll get to research employment options and receive support to prepare you for that all important job, including CV writing, covering letters and mock interviews. We have a dedicated online jobs board, which is updated daily.

Having relevant, up-to-date and valuable work experience will make you stand out from the crowd when seeking full-time employment in your chosen field. We encourage all students to find part-time work whilst at college to help develop their employability skills. We're proud of our strong industry links and offer work experience placements for all levels of study.

UNIVERSITY PREPARATION

Not all students enter into employment upon completion of their sixth form course, in fact, around 50% choose instead to study further at university level. Several of our courses have direct learning pathways into University College Jersey (UCJ), but regardless of whether students choose to attend UCJ, or whether they go further afield, we support them fully as they take this next step.


MATHS, ENGLISH AND HUMAN BIOLOGY GCSES

Having competence in Maths and English are the skills most valued and requested by employers. If you haven't achieved a grade 4 or higher at GCSE, you'll work towards them with our dedicated Maths and English tutors and drop-in clinics. If you already have the grades, we'll help you to strengthen and develop these valued skills.

For progression on to some courses, or into some careers such as primary school teaching and nursing, you may find that you will need a GCSE of grade 4 or above in science. If this applies to you, we offer a course preparing for the GCSE Human Biology examination, which you may be able to study as part of your full-time course.

Construction is currently employing around 10% of the working population in Jersey and with the investment in large scale developments we want to ensure and offer an exciting career in construction to employ staff locally. DEC! offers a great introduction into the variety of roles within construction (there are around 140 different roles for any one construction site) along with practical experience which is a unique educational experience for the students.





IGCSE ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

For students who use another language in their day-to-day lives, whether it be Portuguese, Polish, Thai, Romanian, Hungarian or any other of the 7,000 languages in the modern world, we offer the Cambridge iGCSE English as a Second Language qualification.

This has the same value as the iGCSE English as a First Language, is accepted throughout the college as an entry requirement for any of our courses, and is a valid gualification for universities and other further education institutions.

The course will help to improve your communication in a variety of writing styles, improve your vocabulary and range of expression in your spoken language and give you a better understanding of how the English language works.

Alternatively, if you're not quite ready for the iGCSE, we offer other Cambridge qualifications such as KET [Key English Test] and PET (Preliminary English Test).

In the future, given the speed at which volume of data can be generated and accessed, there will be a growing need to analyse the numbers, find actionable insights, to inform business strategy and decisions.




COGNITIVE FLEXIBILITY

WHICH COURSE?

There are a wide range of course programmes and subjects for you to choose from. All of our courses will prepare you for employment and/or university, so it's important you pick the course that best suits your career plans.

APPLIED GENERAL DIPLOMAS

These are qualifications at Level 3 that are the equivalent of 2 or 3 A-levels and are recognised as entry qualifications to university or direct access to employment at technician or junior level jobs. They're awarded and accredited by BTEC (Pearson), CACHE (Council for Awards in Care, Health and Education), NCFE, OCR (Oxford, Cambridge and RSA) and UAL (University of the Arts London), which are English awarding bodies regulated by Ofqual.

These applied Diplomas are split into 2 qualifications. If students study for one year and are successful on their programme, they will achieve an Extended Certificate which is equivalent of 1 full A level. If students study for two years and are successful on their programme, they will achieve an Extended Diploma which is the equivalent of 3 full A levels

TECHNICAL CERTIFICATES AND DIPLOMAS

These are qualifications accredited by English awarding bodies such as ABC, City and Guilds and IMIAL and regulated by Ofqual They're awarded at Level 2 Certificate and Level 3 Diploma and are recognised by employers as entry qualifications into their related industries.

THE JERSEY PROGRESSION QUALIFICATION

The Jersey Progression Qualification has been developed with the support of the States of Jersey Department of Education and in partnership with the awarding body NCFE. It is intended to develop transferable skills and knowledge through an applied subject and with reference to a realistic working environment. The qualification will provide the means by which young people can develop the knowledge, skills and understanding necessary in order to progress to an advanced level in the same or a related subject.

SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL JERSEY STEM BURSARIES FOR GIRLS

The first Soroptimist Club was established over 100 years ago in California and the Jersey Club celebrated its 70th anniversary in December 2020.

The word 'Soroptimist' is an amalgamation of two words derived from the Latin for 'soror' and 'optima', which mean 'sister' and 'best' respectively.

The primary aim of the Service Club is to improve the lives of women and girls. The achievements of this international network, who want 'the best for their sisters', have had a huge impact on the lives of women and girls worldwide.

In 2020, Soroptimist International Jersey became the very first organisation to offer bursaries through the newly established Highlands College Foundation.

The Club partnered with the college by offering three bursaries of £1,500 to girls studying STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) courses at Highlands College after their GCSEs.

Although the importance for businesses to diversify their workforce is gradually being accepted, the reality is that girls are still not believing a career in a STEM subject is for them.

It is hoped that the bursaries will encourage more female students to enter into the six technical areas of study at Highlands College that have historically been

male dominated: Automotive Studies; Building Services; Building Trades; Digital Games Development; Information Technology; and Mechanical Engineering and Welding.

What will I learn?

This course is for you if you are passionate about animal care with an interest in the behaviour, biology and management of animals. Ideal for students new to animal care or with basic knowledge and skills in animal management.

This is to ensure that all sections of CYPES share the same objectives, helping to keep children and young people safe. Children and young people are referred to as any persons under the age of 19.


