FdA/FdSc (Foundation Degree)


A foundation degree is a Level 5 stand alone qualification usually delivered in 2 years full-time or 4 years part-time. All of our foundation degrees combine academic study with work placements. Designed in association with employers. they are qualifications to equip you with the relevant skills, knowledge and understanding to achieve academic results as well as improve performance and productivity in the work place. A foundation degree can be topped up to a full Bachelor's (BA/BsC Hons) degree with an additional year of full-time study.

BSc/BA (Hons) Degree

An honours degree is a Level 6 qualification designed to develop higher-level skills and understanding to work towards a career in management, research and academic pathways. All degree programmes have a strong practical element, and our links with industry partners ensure they are relevant to the professional world to improve your employability and success at the end of your course.

MSc (Master's Degree)

A Master's degree is a Level 7 qualification for those who have completed a full degree. It is an intense period of study, normally lasting 1 year full-time or 2 years part-time and includes both taught and research components (based on a thesis). Master's degrees are for those interested in an academic career or higher level employment such as senior management, directorship and those who want to develop their evaluative and critical-thinking skills in a specialist field.

I graduated in 2014 with a 2:1 BA (Hons) Financial Services and joined JTC at the same time. You realise how important the work placement becomes in terms of preparing you for work - it's a steep learning curve to go from studying on your own timetable to being expected to work 9-5. The work placement prepares you for this where you're faced with daily pressures and deadlines that come with it.

The knowledge gained from the degree has been highly relevant, after recently completing my ICSA Diploma; 4 exams, all of which I had covered on the degree.

It was always my aim to work abroad which is why I chose JTC, due to their global presence. It's important to consider where your employer can take you rather than accepting the first offer that comes along, it took me 2 years to get the move I wanted, but I always knew the opportunity was there if I could prove I was capable. I work as a Supervisor, based in the Cape Town office, assisting with the implementation of the new operating model. I am responsible for the overseeing of Jersey clients which is distributed amongst a team of 4.



BA (Hons) Business & Management Graduate. Consultant, Greenlight Jersey

I work as a Consultant at Greenlight, a specialist in business and technology transformation. Greenlight provides a wide range of services, from project management and business analysis, through to system selection and implementation. Currently I'm working across 2 different projects, managing a system implementation and supporting 2 process-improvement initiatives. These projects have required a number of different skills and techniques, from project management and completing documentation such as impact assessments, to analysis-based activities such as requirements-gathering and process-mapping.

There are some clear connections between the Business and Management degree and the job I do now. On a daily basis, I must have an awareness of change management tools and techniques, as well as displaying elements of leadership. Both featured frequently throughout the degree modules and were discussed at length in lectures. Undoubtedly the real benefit was the ability to put theory into practice during work placements, where I experienced how leadership and change actually works in practice. Ultimately this has given me an insight into things that work well and not so well, leading me to develop my own style.

Having access to the support you need, when you need it, can make all the difference to your learning experience and success. Not everyone will need it, but if you do, we are here to help. Starting university is a rite of passage but you are not expected to cope alone; there are numerous support systems in place to help you adjust to this transition.

Personal tutors

You will have regular tutorials with your personal tutor which will give you the opportunity to discuss your progress and resolve any emerging academic support needs.

Student support

Our Student Support service is confidential and can be accessed to support you with those problems that life can intermittently throw at you. If your circumstances suddenly change and you find yourself in financial difficulties we can also provide you with information about the student hardship fund. The most important factor for us is that students ask for help and don't allow challenging circumstances to be the reason for dropping out of their course.

Our support team are on hand to help with issues relating to finance, relationships, health and wellbeing. You can access student support by speaking to any member of the department or contact us in confidence to arrange a one to one session.

Learning support

Our Learning Support service helps students who have a variety of needs, including dyslexia and medical conditions such as epilepsy, diabetes and depression. Some students have received a diagnosis when they start university, whereas for others, assessment is part of the service and we can advise if dyslexia, dyspraxia or similar conditions are suspected. We can then use this information to ensure that your learning experience at UCJ is both supported and inclusive.

Careers guidance

Work placements are offered with each degree course to give students a breadth of work experience, the opportunity to build their professional networks and gain essential employability skills and experience. As well as this, we have a dedicated Careers and Employability team who are available to discuss options, guidance and support with you. We are proud to note that 95% of students graduating in 2016 were offered firm job roles on graduating.

Mature students

We appreciate that for many students returning to study after a break in education can present its own set of challenges, including the juggling of commitments of home-life and perhaps giving up a salary. In recognition of this, you are allocated a personal tutor who is your first point of contact should you find yourself struggling with your course. In addition, we also run workshops on study skills which can include note taking, essay writing and time management, and have drop-in sessions where you can access additional support.

China Trip

Each summer, students have the opportunity to spend three weeks in China at two Partner Universities at Huzhou University in Zhejiang Province and the University in Beijing. Students learn about Chinese culture. Mandarin, society and business, local food and sightsee around each province. They get to practically learn how to make Chinese food, Chinese massage and martial arts and visit local Chinese families. Highlights are the Beijing Opera and visits to the Summer Palace, the Great Wall, Forbidden City, Tiananmen Square, Bird's Nest Olympic Stadium and Water Cube.

New York Trip

This biennial study trip is a highlight of the academic calendar at UCJ. The six day excursion takes in points of interest including the United Nations, UNESCO, Wall Street, the Federal Reserve Bank and the American Museum of Natural History. We also see a Broadway show, reach the top of the Empire State Building, enjoy a boat cruise to the Statue of Liberty and a basketball game at Madison Square Garden.

London Trip

First year students on Construction Management degree can undertake a residential week at London South Bank University. They receive tuition for their Research Project module and gives students a chance to engage with international students on campus. Students also access specialist science and material laboratories, enjoy a social evening with LSBU staff and go on a specialised site visit in London.



The best aspect of my UCJ experience so far would definitely be getting the opportunity to travel to China for four weeks last summer after finishing my first year, where I stayed at a Chinese University, learnt Mandarin and walked the Great Wall of China.

Diploma in Humanities & Diploma in Science

Why choose this course?

What will I learn?

This programme is an intensive 1 year course, which is both challenging and intensive, condensing the content of a traditional A-level programme into one year. Learners should be prepared to commit time and effort to their studies in order to succeed. Offered in two Access pathway options: Diploma in Humanities and Diploma in Science; both designed to enable learners to progress onto a broad range of degrees.

Access with Diploma in Humanities

Includes the study of psychology, history and sociology, as well as developing important core academic skills such as critical reading and referencing, essay writing, using IT and preparing for examinations.

Access with Diploma in Science

Designed to encourage a spirit of scientific enquiry through exposure to the study and practice of hard science, such as chemistry, and soft science like psychology. Studies in biology will also help prepare students for further studies in nursing and related sectors of the medical profession.







What will I learn?

Designed with the professional support of police and probation services to provide strong local and vocational relevance, this course offers a rigorous discipline of core skills development, particularly in research methods with 60% focus on Psychology and 40% on Criminology. The course offers a full understanding of theoretical and applied issues that form contemporary debate. Modules cover all key areas of Psychology, with Criminology focusing on the causes of criminal behaviour and the treatment of offenders within England & Wales and local criminal






