Save The Date! 6th Form Awards Ceremony 24th June 2021 We have started to increase the amount of time that students spend on site, in response to parent and student feedback. We are also continuing to host **free Lateral Flow Testing for our FE students on a weekly basis**. We encourage all young people to take up this offer, to try to keep us all safe.

Ofqual, the UK exams regulator, has recently released the findings from their consultation on awarding exam grades, this year.

Due to the possibility of safety issues with exams, and the ongoing disruption for many students, teachers will be able to use evidence about performance to assess students (**Centre Assessed Grades**). This evidence will include mock exams and class work. This applies to iGCSEs in Maths, English and Human Biology, plus some Vocational areas. 

University Applications: If your son/daughter has applied for university starting in 2021, they should be receiving offers back from their universities through UCAS. Please make sure that they are responding to any correspondence that is being sent to them. If they don't, they may miss out on important deadlines that the university has put in place.

Applications for Student Finance must be completed by 31st March to ensure all funding arrangements are in place for the start of term in September: see Gov.Je for details.

Student Support Services - A Reminder of What We Offer

As well as the guidance provided by the Careers and Employability team (above) the College also has a range of other support available for students.

Learning Support

Students have access to a team of specialist staff with knowledge in communication/visual support, learning disabilities and difficulties, and the Autism Spectrum.

We have different models of support to enable students to be as independent as possible; in the classroom, in a small group or a 1-1 outside of class, and online via Microsoft Teams. We also offer open access study skills support sessions in our Learning Resources Centre and online for students that don't need or want to commit to a regular support service.

We work with learners closely to ensure we are providing them with a support package that works best for them.

Maths and English

Did you know that all our Further Education students at Highlands continue to study maths and English until they achieve a 4 at GCSE (or equivalent)?

Studies show that the achievement of these skills enhances life chances and income over a lifetime – up to £100,000!

Students are taught by a dedicated team of specialist teachers as part of their timetable, usually through a mix of online and classroombased lessons. All students are expected to attend unless they have already achieved these qualifications – please help us to help your son or daughter by talking to them regularly about these important core skills.
