Parent and Community Engagement



What is parent engagement?

A meaningful relationship between the parent/carer and tutors with the goal of better learning and wellbeing outcomes for the student. Parent engagement goes beyond 'parent involvement' at college. Parent engagement directly benefits a teenager's learning at college and home.



What is the role of the community?

Sustainable relationships with the local community, including child and health services, community organisations, education and training providers, local businesses and industry may be used to leverage experiences, support, intellectual and physical resources not available with the college to improve students' learning and wellbeing outcomes.

The Parent and Community Engagement Framework

Educational establishments that continue to renew, strengthen and innovate their approach to engaging with parents and the wider community are rewarded with improved college community cohesion, student achievement and job satisfaction for staff. This framework prompts the college to reflect on their current practice, suggests strategies for engagement, and assists in ensuring college approaches align with CYPES policies.
