Level 4 Diploma in Therapeutic Counselling

About five or six years ago, I was made aware of three people, reasonably close to me, who had been suffering with their Mental Health but who had hidden it extremely well. These three had sadly taken their own lives, leaving behind a myriad of questions and incredulity of how we, as a society, could not have noticed how bad their distress was. After this I approached a few charities involved with Mental Health and volunteered at all of them while gaining valuable knowledge and insight into the huge issue that Mental Health presented.

My interest piqued and I realised I wanted to be proactive in supporting people to manage their symptoms before helplessness and desperation took over. I became curious about what might be involved in training as a counsellor and initially signed up for the 10-week introduction course, never imagining that counselling would very soon take over my life in the way that it has done.

The courses at Highlands have been second to none in my opinion. From the very first introductory session right through Levels 2,3 and 4, I have been supported, encouraged, guided, and kept highly motivated throughout. Every single tutor I have had, has been filled with a passion for this vocation which has subsequently rubbed off on me. I have lived, worked, and breathed these years as a direct result of the huge range of knowledge and incredible experiences of the tutors I've been lucky enough to have teach me. No matter is too small to query or too large to be managed and dealt with in an appropriate manner.

All tutors in my experience have been highly professional and adhered strictly to policy and procedures, while also making themselves available for all idiosyncrasies of the wealth of students who apply. I can't thank them enough for teaching me in a way that has been suitable for me individually and allowing me an insight into the huge range of possibilities for work and further education.

I feel extremely sad as I reach the end of my diploma. While covering many years, it feels as though it's gone by in a flash, and I just want to keep on absorbing more and more of the tutor's knowledge as I know we have barely scraped the surface. I will

continue to work in the Mental Health arena and hope to gain work as a counsellor at the very least or go on to develop my own private practice alongside some fellow students. I hope to continue learning and benefiting from the higher education offered at Highlands by applying for the Level 5 course planned for the new year. As an older student, accepted and encouraged just the same as my younger peers, I really don't want this journey to end.

Highlands, for me, was an obvious choice. I liked the fact that it has always been in the background offering courses to adults who, for whatever reasons, feel they would like to continue learning and discovering new aspects of themselves. It is convenient being in town and offers wide open rooms to study in, with outside green space to sit outside when breaking for lunch. It also has the added benefit of substantial parking areas.
